## Middle School News

“Integrity, Resisting Hatred, and Bearing Witness” are just three themes that surrounded a three week unit on World War II and the Holocaust. As 7th and 8th graders investigated the atrocities of that time, they were challenged to look inward. As the culminating activity, students visited the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, DC where they were given the opportunity to further their educational boundaries and reflect on human morality. The final museum destination allowed them to pray for all the lives that were affected as a result of the Holocaust and to be the person that will remember for all those that can no longer.

The trip ended with a tour of the Newseum. At the Newseum, students learned not only major historical events that have changed our lives, but also the importance of our 1st Amendment rights that democracy allows.

### Crazy 8's Math Club

The Crazy 8's Math Club had sixteen math-loving students from kindergarten, first grade, and second grade for the 8-week session in January and February. The students made a glow-in-the-dark city of 3D shapes with glow sticks, had a beach ball party that included adding numbers as well as a game of ga-ga ball, explored counting money, played a racing car game with adding and subtracting, and created patterns with red and white cubes. The last 8-week session starts March 6th.

### Congratulations ...

Corpus Christi students participated in the IU12 Sumdog Contest this past February 9-15. Sumdog is an adaptive learning program that responds to each individual with questions that match their ability. Almost 2,000 private and public school students from Franklin, York, and Adams counties competed in the online math contest. These students answered a total of 536,892 questions correctly while attempting over 629,000. Corpus Christi's own **Hammad Safi placed fourth**, answering 968 questions correctly, only one point away from the third and second place winners.

### STEAM Adventures Club



There were 18 students enrolled in our STEAM Adventures Club for kindergarten, first grade, and second grade during December, January, and February. In December, we tried out some Christmas STEAM activities by making a shelf for an elf with craft sticks and play-doh. We also built Christmas trees with green cups. During January, we learned about Snowflake Bentley and how to fold paper to make beautiful, symmetrical snowflakes. For February, we focused on the Winter Olympic events of ski jumping, snowboarding, and figure skating. Our final three month session will be held once a month during March, April, and May.

### First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion

Our second grade students received the sacrament of First Reconciliation on February 17, 2018. They will receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion on April 28, 2018. Please pray for these students as they continue on their journey of faith formation.
