- Count your cereal

- sort the different coins into groups
- put different coins into plastic eggs and hunt for them
- play restaurant
- help pay for items at the store

Skip Counting by 2, 5, & 10

- Skip counting hopscotch
- Count money
- Place your snack in groups and skip count

Patterns

- Draw a picture
- Use your snack to show a pattern
- Build with Legos in a pattern
- Go on a walk and see if you can find patterns

Shapes

(2D and 3D)

- Take a walk and find/identify the different shapes you see
- Draw a picture using various shapes
- use shaving cream in a bag and draw the shapes
- Do a scavenger hunt to find the different shapes in the house
